



# What is the Pupil Premium (PP)?

The Pupil Premium is extra government money which is paid to schools to support children's learning and development.

At Leverton Church of England Academy we can choose how to best spend the Pupil Premium money, working with families to ensure your child benefits from the additional funding.

Schools receive money for each pupil of compulsory school age who fits the eligibility criteria. Therefore, we wanted to explain the four categories of eligibility for Primary ages pupils, with different amounts of funding attached:

- **Pupils in year groups EYFS to Year 6 who are meet the criteria of Free School Meals. (£1345)**
- **Pupils deemed as 'Looked After Children' – I.e those in the care of the Local Authority (£2345)**
- **Pupils previously cared for by the local Authority (£2345)**
- **Pupils with parents in the regular armed forces (£310)**

Your child could benefit from:

- ❖ School Milk
- ❖ Subsidised trips/residential
- ❖ Uniform
- ❖ Breakfast club
- ❖ Learning resources

For the parents of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium we will set up a fund of £50 for each child each year.

This can be used when purchasing uniform, paying for school trips or paying for after school clubs – You decide how the money is best used to benefit and support your child/children).

Pupil Premium Funds enable school to employ additional adults to support pupils in school. Each year a report will be published on our school website explaining how our Pupil Premium has been allocated.



## Do you receive any of these benefits?

Your child might be able to get free school meals, if you get any of the following:

- ❖ Income Support
- ❖ income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- ❖ income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- ❖ support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- ❖ the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- ❖ Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- ❖ Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- ❖ Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

## DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know if your child is in EYFS, Year 1 or Year 2 they are entitled to a FREE hot school meal everyday as part of the National Universal Free School Meals Scheme. Even if your child is in EYFS, Year 1 or Year 2, it is important that if you receive a qualifying benefit you still register for free school meals under the eligibility scheme.
