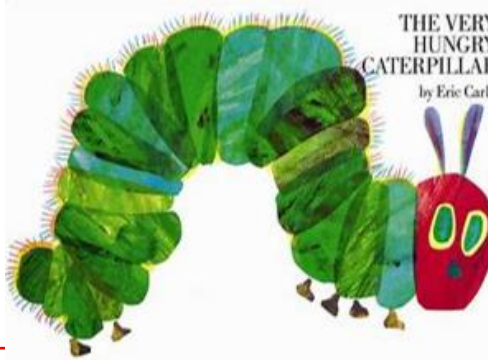


PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

- Consider whether the food the caterpillar ate was healthy. Can you think of a healthy meal for the caterpillar to eat?
- Complete an obstacle course whilst moving on your belly like a caterpillar.
- Think about how a caterpillar/butterfly moves around/ can you move your body like this?

EXPRESSIVE ARTS & DESIGN

- Butterfly painting on folded paper
- Painting the caterpillar with sponges
- Have a go at cooking some food for the caterpillar.
- Create different sized caterpillars and butterflies using malleable materials.
- Make a caterpillar from an egg box.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

- Learning the life cycle of a caterpillar
- Looking for caterpillars and butterflies
- Create a fact file all about caterpillars. Where is their habitat? How do they survive?

MATHEMATICS

- Symmetry of butterflies
- Repeating patterns using food
- Counting the amounts of food. How many items of food did the caterpillar eat altogether?
- Ordering the story using pictures of each page.
- Size ordering caterpillars and butterflies.
- Record how long it takes you to eat one apple, compare that to how long it takes to eat 3 strawberries.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- If you could turn into a butterfly, where would you fly to?
- Would you rather stay as a caterpillar or turn into a butterfly? Why?
- What is your favourite food? Would you share it with the caterpillar?

LITERACY

- Can you write the names of food that were in the story?
- Write a sentence telling me your favourite food.
- Draw the items of food the caterpillar ate and label them.
- Draw a butterfly and label the parts of the body.
- Draw a story map to help you to re-tell the story.
- Re-tell the story, changing the foods. Can you write this story?

COMMUNICATION & LANGUAGE

- Learning the names of the different foods. Can you use adjectives to describe these foods?
- Learning the vocabulary involved with the life cycle of a caterpillar.
- Act out the story with some pretend food and make your own cocoon.
- Sitting in a circle, each child says "On Monday the caterpillar ate one apple", and follow on from each other, adding a food item each time.
