☀️ Interesting Facts for Pupils

- The River Severn is over 350 km long — the longest in the UK.
- The Equator never moves, but the Earth spins on its axis once every 24 hours.
- The Prime Meridian runs through Greenwich, London.
- The River Trent flows near North Leverton and eventually reaches the North Sea.
- Norway stretches further north than any other European country.

| Word | Meaning | Example / How We Use It |
|-----------|--|------------------------------|
| Continent | A very large area of land on Earth. | Europe is a continent. |
| Country | A place with its own borders and government. | England is part of the UK. |
| County | A smaller area inside a country. | Nottinghamshire is a county. |
| City | A large place where many people live. | London is a city. |
| Town | A place smaller than a city. | Worksop is a town. |
| Village | A small place where people live. | North Leverton is a village. |
